Abstract: "Beyond the North American Super Basin Mudrock Plays: The Unconventional Development of Conventional Reservoirs"

The past dozen or so years have resulted in unpresented production growth from a new class of reservoir, the mudrock, or what is more commonly referred to as "shale". Integral to the commercial development of the mudrocks was the development of isolated multi-stage hydraulic fracturing. The application of this technology to horizontal drilling in low permeability conventional reservoirs has led to a new type of exploration/exploitation. I will take a look at where this exploration/exploitation effort has been proven commercial and hopefully offer ideas as to what other conventional reservoirs might be candidates for this technology.

Mr. Stoneburner is currently a director of Yuma Exploration and Tamboran Resources as well as numerous Pine Brook portfolio companies.
