This year, the Historical Society will explore the geology of Mason County with geologist Bryan Hunt from UT Austin. This informative evening will provide insights into the local landscape and its history. Attendees will learn about various epochs, from when the seas covered the county, to when dinosaurs roamed the landscape, and later, when mammoths thrived.

Hunt is a past president of the Austin Geological Society. His interests include geologic mapping and hydrogeology in Central and West Texas. He creates detailed geologic maps and databases for the Bureau of Economic Geology. Established in 1909, the Bureau of Economic Geology is the oldest research unit of The University of Texas.

Visitors are encouraged to bring rock samples for identification. Refreshments will be provided as attendees deepen their understanding of local geology and foster community involvement.
